Title IX Responses to Charges from Re-Visit on February 21, 2006

<u>Meal Policy</u>: Caldwell County High school will not be responsible for athletes meals to and from athletic contests unless the athletes qualify for State Competition. Allowances to the state qualifying athletes will be based on the allowances that the KHSAA Handbook possesses and this \$5.00 per meal per person as long as they remain in competition at the state level. <u>Retirement of Jersey/Uniform Policy:</u> Caldwell County High School will retire and display any Jersey or uniform of a Caldwell County High School graduate who becomes a Professional Athlete of any kind. The exhibit will take place in the foyer of the Community Activities Building (Gym) and will also posses a picture of that athlete in his/her uniform of that professional team.

Written Locker Room Assignments: Basketball - Girls Basketball Locker Room is located on your right(west side) as you enter from the front of the gymnasium. The Boys Basketball Locker Room is located on your right(east side) as you enter from the front of the gymnasium. The visitor's locker rooms are located on the opposite ends of the gymnasium and next to the concession stand and are also used as physical education locker rooms for both girls and boys. Soccer-Soccer Dressing rooms are located across the street from the Soccer Field. Boys Soccer Dressing Room is located in the Blue Block Building on Washington Street and as you enter from the front entrance of the Blue Building it is the locker room to the right (north side). Girls Soccer Dressing Room is located in the same building and is the dressing room on the left (south side). Football, Cross Country, Track. and Tennis Dressing Rooms: These dressing rooms are located at the Field House located on Beckner Lane just before you get to the high school. Football, Boys Cross Country, Boys Track, and Boys Tennis Dressing Room is located on the East side if the Field House. Girls Cross Country, Girls Track, and Girls Tennis dressing rooms are located on the West side of the Field House. Volleyball: Dressing Rooms for Girls Volleyball are located at the Butler Gym on West Main Street. As you enter the Butler gym the dressing rooms for both the Lady Tigers and visitors are located on the right (West) side of the gym. The visitors are the closest to the main entrance and the "Lady Tigers" dressing room is located on the opposite end. Baseball/Softball Locker Rooms: There are no specific locker rooms designated for Baseball and softball since both teams play at Legion Park which is located on the south side of Princeton and not on campus.
