D.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to the survey there is a significant number of girls interested in swimming. One hundred and eleven girls have responded to the survey. The school has acknowledged this interest on form T-3 and is required to conduct meetings with these interested students and document the findings of each meeting with students and parents. This documentation should be filed in the Title IX folder. The school did not acknowledge this interest on the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60). It appears from the expenditures submitted that the school spends \$367 more per athlete on the male students. The administrator and the schools' Gender Equity Committee should review this matter to see if spending in athletics is being done in an equitable manner. The school did submit an explanation regarding spending, however \$367 is significant and should be evaluated.
