D.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: Based on responses to the Interscholastic Athletic Survey, it appears that the feasibility of additing swimming and tennis should be expected. It is particularly important that meetings with potential team members be held and minutes kept since attaining the standard for Participation Opportunities Test Three is necessary for Title IX compliance. Please review expenditures for athletics. Spending per male athlete is \$599 and spending per female athlete is \$371. The disparity, even when the difference in funding for the basketball program is not considered, is rather large and it would be appropriate to review expenditures and closely monitor spending so that a pattern of inequity is not established.
