The Gender Equity Committee should work to minimize this difference. T-41 shows an advantage to the boys' program in the areas of Equipment and Supplies and Travel and Per Diem allowances. This is not mentioned on the T-60 Corrective Action Plan and it should be The Gender Equity Committee should address this omission and include this on next years T-60 form. The school should continue to include extra travel expenses, above the Board of Education expenses, on their T-35 and T-36 forms just as they did this year. Thank you for all your hard work.


