CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN TIME TABLE FOR CORRECTIVE ACTION/COMPLETION

Attachment #1

A club was formed; however, no records of meetings, number of participants, etc were kept. Because we have no records that reflect the lack of interest, we will once again try to form a volleyball club to determine the actual amount of interest in adding volleyball to the sports programs. First meetings will occur in the spring of 2004.

Sign ups for girls' volleyball were held in January. Fifty-two high school students in grades 9-11 signed up indicating they are interested in playing high school volleyball. In March, a meeting was held with girls interested in participating in volleyball. Seventeen girls showed up for this meeting. The athletic director has also contacted companies about the cost of equipment and uniforms, has run an analysis on transportation cost and has had a cost estimate for preparing the gym for volleyball completed. In February, the AD presented information to the board of education providing statistics on interest and the costs for implementing the program. The AD also contacted 15 schools to determine if they could add Webster County HS to their 2005-2006 schedules. Only seven schools responded; however, only three of those can schedule a 2005-2006 match. The WCHS SBDM Council has decided not to offer the program in 2005-2006.

The 2005-2006 student survey continues to show a significant level of interest in the sport.

Attachment #2

The girls' soccer team played their home matches in the Fall, 2005 in Trojan Stadium, which is the football stadium located on the WCHS campus.

The ground work on the soccer field was completed in the Fall, 2005. Grass was sewn and is flourishing. The newly established field has received extensive damage from the locally heavy deer population. The field will have to be reworked. Before undertaking this work a fence will be installed around the outer perimeter of the complex to deter the deer from further damaging the field. In 2006, it is a possibility that the soccer matches will have to return to Trojan Stadium. The lights are scheduled to be in place by the 2007 soccer season.

Attachment #3

A uniform replacement schedule through the 2010-2011 school year was created in September, 2005. The plan was distributed to all of the coaches and posted on the athletics bulletin board located in the main hall of the high school. The replacement schedule may also be viewed in the athletic director's office as it is posted there. The plan has been submitted to KHSAA and has been placed in the Webster County file. It will be used as a model for other schools to follow.

Attachment #4

A written policy regarding the necessary credentials and accomplishments for an athlete or team to be honored with banners, awards or recognition within the school was completed in January, 2006. The policy has been approved by the WCHS SBDM Council and has been implemented. A copy of the policy was also submitted to KHSAA and is part of the Webster County file.

Attachment #5

Boys' wrestling will be added after the school has added a girls' volleyball program. The addition of volleyball will satisfy Title IX requirements, and the addition of both programs will correlate with interest presented in the student survey. Additions of these groups may be made for the 2007-2008 school year or when funding is available.
