This is appropriately addressed on the T-60 for improvement in 2006-2007. Spending per athlete shows the school spends \$489 per male athlete, whereas only #350 per female athlete. More than \$100 difference in schools with a football program is an alert showing this area needs to be improved. T-63 survey return rate was 75%. The KHSAA would like an 80% return rate. The Gender Equity Committee can address methods to increase return rates. Thank you very much.
