- We have printed schedule cards at no expense with Football on one side and Volleyball on the other. Same for Boys and Girls Basketball. (Note: B/G Basketball cards, though ordered, did not come in. Change over in company at time of printing. Order lost. By time discovered, it was too late.)
- 2. We have a football program. It is run through the Belfry Boosters and proceeds are used for all sports.
- 3. B/G Track budget combined as equipment, uniforms are purchased simultaneously. B/G travel together and 1 coach does both.
- B/G Cross country combined as uniforms are purchased simultaneously. B/G travel together and 1 coach does both. Parents drove kids this year and had no expenses.
- 5. Football team had higher travel expense due to paying for band and cheerleader buses, and taking 3 buses to varsity games.
- Softball team purchased new uniforms 2 years ago and had higher expenditures than baseball. Did not need as much as past two years. Baseball purchased new uniforms 05-06 and had higher expenses.
- 7. Began soccer in 05-06. Coach only gave 1 trophy each for boys/girls.
- 8. Boys expenses higher due to football: more numbers, higher cost of equipment, salaries (more asst coaches), etc.
- 9. B/G Basketball teams have paid position for another assistant coach but no opening at present time.
- 10. At present, the BOE has no allotment for coaching salaries for B/G soccer. However, at the last budget committee meeting our principal brought this up and the BOE is going to look at it.
