It appears the spending has widened its margin. The Gender Equity Committee needs to address this inequity at the first meeting of the 2007-2008 school year and come up with a plan that corrects this inequity. The advantage the boys have was not so noted on form T-41. The school did mention on the Corrective Action Plan, to meet with coaches to verify purchasing procedures. The school needs to see that spending on male and female athletes falls within \$100 of eah other.
