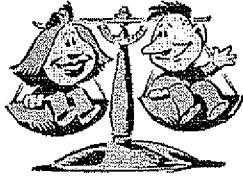

The amount spent on individual athletes averaged \$594 per male athlete and \$440 per female athlete. KHSAA auditors consider a differential of \$100 to be acceptable for schools with football due to equipment expense in that sport. Since the difference here is 50% greater for male athletes, it is recommended that school personnel evaluate the quality of benefits afforded athletes of both genders. School personnel are commended for progress made toward offering girls more opportunities for sport participation and for providing better facilities for that participation.
