		to spending per female athlete. According to the 2006-2007 Annual Report,
		approximately \$227 more was expended per male athlete as compared to spending per
		female athlete. This disparity appears to be very large, particularly given Livingston
		Central does not field a football team. It is suggested that spending be closely monitored
		to insure that an inequity in expenditures is not repeasted on an annual basis.








