The data submitted indicates that the school is currently meeting the standard established in Test #1 for provision of athletic opportunities. In relation to provision of athletic benefits, the schools' spending for the past year appears to be outside of acceptable parameters. Submitted information indicates the school is spending approximately \$561 per male athlete as compared to approximately \$288 per female athlete for provision of total athletic benefits. This spending should be closely monitored for equity by school officials as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee.
