Dear Mr. Boucher:

This letter is an addendum to our Title IX report for the 2006-2007 school year. At the advice of Fran Edwards, we were asked to clarify some of the responses from the 2006 student interest survey reported on form T3 in the 2006-2007 report.

Based on the information received via the 2006 student survey, there is significant interest in three activities not currently offered as interscholastic sports at Rowan County Senior High School. The first of these is bowling.

The local bowling alley in Morehead (The Great Viking Bowling Center) currently sponsors a bowling team for 14-18 year old high school students. This team competes against other area teams in a similar age group. This group is not school affiliated and is not financial support by the school system. This team does meet the interests of our male and female students, and because the KHSAA does not currently sponsor bowling as a sport, is a wonderful opportunity for these students.

The second sport noted on the student interest survey is archery. The Rowan County Middle School offers an intramural archery group and competes in an annual state competition. This program has not been carried over to the high school, but we are currently looking into offering archery as an intramural activity as it is not a sport sanctioned by the KHSAA.

The final sport that was reported as having significant student interest was JV tennis. We do have adequate numbers of students in our boy's and girl's tennis programs to field JV teams, however in our area many other schools do not. While we do not have a "JV Tennis team" all of the students participating in tennis do get an opportunity to compete when the schools we play have adequate numbers to allow matches.
