Dear Mr. Creech:

Cordia High School was sent a Title IX Status Report for your 2006-2007 Annul Title IX Report in May 2007.

Under the Recommendation and Comments Section of that Status Report concern was expressed about the difference in expenditures for male and female athletes. That report noted that your school had made progress; however, you were asked to continue to closely review expenditures for athletics. The report also noted that if there were circumstances that caused a larger amount of money to be spent on male participants, then those circumstances should be documented, and sent with Cordia's next April 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Report.

Another concern expressed in the Status Report last year was the lack of student athletes on your Gender Equity Committee.

When reviewing your April 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Report submission for 2007-2008 there appears to be no evidence that you have followed the requests from the 2006-2007 Status Report. When reviewing the figures for expenditures there is an error in the amount given for expenditures for boys. Your data indicated that \$33,355.00 was spent on boys, when that amount should be corrected to \$35,847.00. This year, once again, there was a larger percentage (an average of 18% more) spent on male athletes than on female athletes. As one example of the imbalance, the boys' basketball team outspent the girl's basketball team by \$10,000.00 for equipment and supplies. Contrary to what we had requested, there is no explanation given for the larger amount spent on male athletes.

For the past four years your school has consistently spent more money on male athletes than female athletes. This is certainly a red flag in respect to equity in benefits provided to your female athletes. To ensure that you are in compliance in regards to Title IX please submit to the KHSAA a written explanation of the expenditures submitted for the past two years by June 30 2008.
