T 36 Explanations

- Cheerleading 19 female cheerleaders that were not counted on form T1. Six-thousand, four-hundred and thirty-five dollars not counted on the T36 form. The number of female cheerleaders and their expenditures is a true representation of an additional number of female participants and female expenditures.
- There was a 22.3 percent disparity between male and female expenditures on the T 36 form. This is due to the higher cost to safely maintain and equip a football team. During the 2006 2007 school year, the football team also purchased new uniforms. Without football there would be a 13.14 percent financial disparity, with more money being expended on female athletics versus male athletics.
