



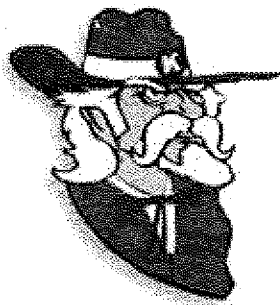

- 3) Review last year's Corrective Action Plan: Billy admitted that he didn't know that we were supposed to purchase t-shirts for all athletes who participated in sport team each season. Billy said he will take care of that by ordering t-shirts after we get back from spring break week.
- 4) Students Athletics Interest Surveys: The percentage of total surveys returned from 8<sup>th</sup> graders is 100% while for 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> graders, it is 87%. Total number of surveys were given out was 54. 49 surveys were handed in. 49 out of 54 is 90%.

For Fall Sports, There were 18 boys signed up for football while 7 boys signed up for soccer. 13 girls signed up for volleyball. We concluded that we will stay with the soccer program based on last year's decision and stay with volleyball program for girls.

For Winter Sports, 18 boys signed up for basketball while 17 girls signed up for basketball. We also concluded that we will stay with the basketball program for both boys and girls.

For Spring Sports, we concluded that we will stay with Track since we don't have any facilities for baseball, softball and tennis.

We decided that we will stay with the programs we currently have.
