- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. #### 2007-08 Title IX / Gender Equity Committee Notes

The following represent issues/concerns discussed by the committee with regards to "red flags" the committee felt were present in the 2007-08 KHSAA Title IX audit.

Following review of the Student Survey, the committee felt that while surveys indicated some interest in the sport of soccer continues, however, this issue was raised two years ago during our last survey. At that time two meetings were held after school hours for those interested in soccer. Attendance was low and it appeared that level of interest was greater in the younger age groups.

The committee noted that the only community soccer program in the county is at the elementary level and that these programs end somewhere around the 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> grade. The committee felt that interest levels would be monitored but until there was a more developed feeder program through grade 8, the addition of a soccer program would be difficult.

Thought was given to soccer at the middle school level, sponsored by the school system. However it was noted that our five elementary/middle schools do not sponsor athletic programs for middle school students other than in the sports of football, volleyball and basketball and that the school administration has shown no interest in establishing such programs.

- ➤ In reviewing the report the committee noted that the school has added JV sports to 4 sports (golf, tennis, track and swimming) during the last few years. An increase in number of participants indicated this need; however, it has been a struggle in various situations trying to find opponents for these teams to compete against.
- Committee discussed at length the "cost" of participation upon parents/students and noted that survey indicated this was a growing concern. In addition several parents have discussed the issue with administration and staff regarding cost of transportation to and from practice. It was noted that this is of great concern due to the fact that we have some students who live up to 20 miles away from the high school.
- Committee noted the funding imbalance between baseball and softball listed on the report. In reviewing this imbalance, it was noted that the 06-07 school year was the designated year for uniform purchase for baseball and that baseball had an overnight tournament scheduled this year which significantly raised the cost of baseball's transportation cost. Additionally, the committee reviewed the previous three-five years spending habits in baseball and softball. It was noted that this did not appear to be a consistent trend/issue but felt it would be best to closely monitor the situation prior to and during the 08-09 school year. The committee felt that a meeting with both the softball and baseball coaches regarding the issue would be appropriate prior to the 08-09 school year.

### Status Report On 2006-2007 Title IX Corrective Action Plan

#### Item #1: Locker Room Improvements G-BKB

With the opening of the new Academic-Athletic facility, the school has been able to shift locker room assignments around to equalize space and support of comparable sports. Primarily the girl's basketball locker room has been moved across the gym to a locker room that is comparable in size to that of the boy's basketball locker room. In addition, lockers have been purchased that are of similar style to those found in the boy's basketball locker room for varsity players. These new lockers however are of steel construction as compared to the wooden lockers in the boy's locker room. The reason for this difference is primarily because of the excessive amount of moisture in the locker room, the lockers in the boy's locker room have become somewhat of an on-going maintenance issue. It was felt by maintenance and custodial services that in the light of the issues surrounding staph/MRSA infection control; a metal would be better than wood when purchasing new lockers.

In addition to this change, other changes in locker room assignments were made to give teams closer access to practice areas, storage rooms, etc.

#### Item #2: Individual Sports Spending

Continue to monitor fund-raising/spending of individual sports and encouraging joint fund raising between similar sports. Booster Club continues to monitor spending/history and continuing practice of spending for all sports. With limited funds Booster Club feels it cannot support every sport every year but can in a 3-5 year window provide funding for all programs.

#### Item #3: Girl's Participation Levels

On-Going, have had increases in girls' numbers in some sports while numbers remain low in others.

#### **Item #4: Increased Sports Offerings**

School has started an archery program during the 2007-08 school year. This program involved 76-80 participants; a majority of which are not involved in any other athletic team. This program met two nights a week for three hours each night.

Attempt was made to start a fitness program after school for staff and students, however, enrollment in classes (spinning, jazzercising & karate) were insufficient for continuation at the present time.

The start-up of Intramural programs was delayed due to questions regarding staffing, cost and facility availability.

#### Item #5: Facilities

With one year of utilization of the new facility under our belt, the school feels it has a better handle on what types of programs and the amount of time programs will utilize space available. Because of this, the school can further develop/monitor equitable use of facilities.
