- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. While there appeared to be ample interest in a Girls Volleyball team, this writer felt that the interest survey did not provide conclusive evidence that the girls at Model would commit to supporting a team. There were surveys where the girls checked that they would like to participate in both girls volleyball and girls soccer (would not be able to play both as they occur during the same sport season); there were boys that checked that they wanted to play on a girls volleyball team; girls did not indicate a strong desire to participate in intramural volleyball; and there were some girls that indicated that they would like to have a volleyball team, but checked that they would not participate.

This writer would suggest the following:

- 1. Create an in house survey that pertains just to girls volleyball with questions that will specifically address any of the confusion that may have occurred within the KHSAA student interest survey.
- If we can get the faculty/staff to commit their time and we can find available gym
 time, introduce an intramural sports program, which would include such
 opportunities as volleyball, to see how it is received by the students.
- 3. Create discussion with the Athletic Council/Gender Equity Committee for potential suggestions and/or ideas.
