Ē	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to information and responses submitted, the school is not currently meeting the standards established in any of the three tests for provision of athletic opportunities. The school offers all sanctioned sports for girls except volleyball. The student survey shows a significant interest in volleyball (131 students). The T-3 form indicates that the school is taking steps to address this interest, but it is not mentioned on the Corrective Action Plan. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending seems to be within acceptable parameters. The school's T-41 does not identify the disparity in the opportunities area already mentioned. This disparity should be addressed by school officials as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee and be a part of future T-41 and T-60 forms submitted to KHSAA.
