

To Whom It May Concern:

The following is an explanation of the differences in total expenditures of the boys' and girls' athletic programs at Ohio County High School.

Baseball had an unexpected and unplanned expenditure in the amount \$23,000 to replace the fence and complete other repairs due to storm damage.

Another unforeseen expenditure of \$2,500 was spent on new sod for the football field to repair damaged areas on the field. The remainder of the \$13,000 of facilities improvements was spent for routine maintenance of the football field. Although the football program may appear excessive, it has the largest number of participants and the most expensive equipment which requires a large budget to operate and insure the safety of our athletes.

We feel that all of our facilities at Ohio County High School are second to none and we make every effort to insure that all programs have the best equipment, uniforms, and supplies to be competitive. I hope this answers any question or concerns that you may have.
