- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. To Whom It May Concern:

I wanted to take this opportunity to explain a few items on our Title IX report. We have no travel expense listed for our Golf and Cross Country programs. Both programs had their players meet them at the courses. I know a bus is usually used to transport athletes but we have two golf courses in Pike County. The location of the facilities allowed parents to transport their own children. The Cross Country course is also located in Pike County just a few miles from our school. Since they had to practice and compete right after school their parents also transported those students. Our buses in Pike County have trouble getting back to our school for athletic events. Therefore, the coaches and parents wanted to make other arrangements for transportation.

The other item I wanted to explain was the fact that the Title IX report shows no awards expense. We did have banquets for our players and teams. The booster clubs of each program paid for the awards. Since no booster club turned in records and no funds ran through the school it was impossible for me to record that expense. As the new principal I have corrected this problem by making all booster clubs run everything through the school. We now have records for all activities that take place at Pike Central.

To make sure all athletes are recognized we are having an athletic banquet at the end of the year for all sports programs. We have also started putting together a Hall of Fame committee to recognize our school and community accomplishments.

We have addressed the lack of records for the 2007-08 school year and we expect to be able to present very accurate reports in the future.
