E	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to calculations submitted, the school is meeting the standard established in Test 1 for provision of athletic opportunities. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is currently far outside of acceptable parameters (i.e. \$720 per male athlete compared to \$330 per female athlete). This issue appears to be addressed in the school's Corrective Action Plan. Monitoring spending should take place to insure that the imbalance does not continue over a two-year period. School officials are also reminded that KHSAA requests that all Gender Equity Review Committees have student representatives each year.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
