### Mr. Ragland:

Our conversation this morning was beneficial in clarifying expectations of Trimble County High School and the KHSAA.

As discussed, in the count of coaches per sport on Form T-35/36, volunteers are listed as well as paid coaching positions, provided their qualifications are on par with paid coaches. The concept is that athletes have access to equally-qualified coaching, and that the ratio of coaches to athletes for males and females are balanced.

You clarified that school personnel are aware of the fact that fewer paid coaches for softball and volleyball, both girls' sports, and four coaches for two teams in one boys' sport reflects a skew towards better access to coaching for males than females. This benefit, COACHING, needs analysis by school administration and the Gender Equity Review Committee and placed

on Form T-60, Corrective Action Plan, in the 2008-2009 annual Title IX report.

Regarding a school awards policy, KHSAA considers it imperative to generate a written policy that reflects the school's concept of recognizing achievement and effort on the part of participants in the athletics program. Per our discussion, it appears practices in place at the school already should be written out and reviewed to assure all sports operate within policy and that no gender bias exists. The Gender Equity Review Committee minutes should reflect its review of the policies and the recommendations the Committee makes from the review.

Highest priority should be given to address the school's failure to meet any of the standards for compliance with the opportunities for participation segment of Title IX. Increasing participation in track and volleyball at the middle school is considered a step towards developing opportunities for future high school students; however careful attention should be given to new interests that may emerge from future student surveys.

For the school's file at the KHSAA, please reply to this email with revised data for Forms T-35/36 on COACHES/TEAMS which would include any volunteer coaches attached to high school teams. Your reply will conclude the review of the school's annual Title IX report.

Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
