Dear Mr. Rupsch:

This letter is in regards to our discussion of your 2007-2008 Annual Title IX report. As you know in order to be in compliance with the Title IX Law a school must meet one of the three tests for opportunities. Presently your school does not meet Test One or Test Two. Your Student Interest Survey indicated that 127 girls express interest in playing volleyball. You did address this interest on your Corrective Action Plan; however, your time table is not satisfactory. You explained that your school is having financial problems and could not fully implement a program next year due to cost of equipment etc.

I met with Mr. Boucher to explain your situation. We would like to offer these suggestions so that you may receive credit for meeting Test Three (Full and Effective Accommodations of Interests and Abilities).

- Install equipment in your present school and begin next year.
- Consider an away schedule for competition only. (You could possibly schedule fewer than the maximum number of games allowed.
- Consider a JV schedule for competition only.
- Limit travel to tournaments of other sports so that funds would be available for volleyball.
- Cut a coach in another sport to provide funds for a volleyball coach.
- Begin an intramural program next year to develop skill and begin competition the following year.

I hope these suggestions are helpful to you. Please submit to the KHSAA a revised time-table for implementation of a volleyball program by June 30, 2008.
