Dear Ms. Mullins:

As requested by your Status Report correspondence of 11 May 2009, I am responding with the rationale for the imbalance of coach's salaries / stipends in relation to the number of teams and participants. Attached is a current copy of our salary schedule. Across our schedule you will note that our salaries are balanced and are the same regardless of gender. However, the fact is that we do not have a sport that is comparable to football in a female sport. Football is our most inclusive sport in the school. Of the 117 male students in grades 9 – 12, fifty four male students or 46.15% of all males participated in varsity football for the 2008-2009 school year. Accordingly the sheer number of athletes makes the coaching positions necessary which inflates the salary schedule. Furthermore, there is simply no easy way to put salaries in a position that balance. Since salaries / stipends are set by the Bellevue Independent Schools Board of Education, the only options are:

- ✓ Create another female sport that would allow for competition and attract enough female
 athletes
- ✓ Delete our football program (our most inclusive sport)
- ✓ Raise or lower salaries across the board while keeping football the same

None of these options are particularly palatable or viable, and they are not within the realm of my authority. In addition, the coaching stipends may appear on the surface to be inequitable, but there is only a 4% difference (52% to 48%) and we are currently spending \$393.00 per female athlete vice \$334.00 per male athlete. If we were permitted to count cheerleading the percentage gap would decline and the spending per female athlete figure would increase. Finally, in my conversations with my athletic director and those of other school administrators and athletic directors of similar sized schools in our district, I must say that our salaries are commensurate with the duties performed if not less than those in our region of the Commonwealth.

I recognize that this may not be the best rationale, but given the current bleak financial situation it is the best we can do. I sincerely believe that our current level is the most equitable solution at the present time. If I can assist further in this matter please do not hesitate to contact me at (859) 261-2980.
