Dear Commissioner DeVries;

Upon receiving our Title IX Status Report for 2008-2009, I noticed a request under Section II, part E for an explanation about the size of expenditures for football awards. The dollar amount listed on our KHSAA Title IX report for 2008-2009 is for 17 letterman jackets for juniors and 16 picture plaques awarded to senior members of our football team. Boyd Co. High School awards letterman jackets to junior student athletes who have met the criteria established in 1992. Per school policy, the school orders the letterman jackets but the booster organization is responsible for paying for them. As requested, I have also included a copy of the Boyd Co. High School policy for awarding letters and letterman jackets.

- 3. COMPLETE SEASON

*STANDARDIZED SWEATER POLICY:

RECIPIENT MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. BE OF SOPHOMORE STATUS
- 2. TWO YEARS OF LETTERING

IF A PLAYER VOLUNTARILY QUITS HIS/HER SPORT OR IS DISMISSIZD FOR ANY REASON, HE/SHE WILL LOSE ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS OF ANY NATURE, INCLUDING JACKETS.

*A STUDENT IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE AN OFFICIAL JACKET OF SWEATER EITHER THROUGH BOOSTER FUNDS IF AVAILABLE OF PERSONAL FUNDS IF BOOSTERS HAVE NO FUNDS.

Baseball & Girl's Softball:

Must enter or play in at least 50 % of the total varsity games played during the season. Any type of participation is an entry.

Boy's and Girl's Basketball:

Attend all scheduled varsity practices and games for the entire season.

Swimming:

Qualify for the Regional Meet.

Score at least a total of 13 points during the varsity season meets.

Cross Country:

Compete in at least 75% of the scheduled regular season meets. Compete in the Regional Meet.

Athletic Trainers & Managers:

Work practice and games for two varsity sport seasons.

Golf:

Play in at least one (1) varsity match during the regular season.

Boy's & Girl's Soccer:

Play in at least 50% of the total varsity games during the regular season.

Volleyball:

Play in at least 50% of the total varsity games during the regular season.

Tennis:

Play in at least six (6) varsity matches (singles or doubles) during the regular season.

Qualify for the Regional Meet.
