Potential areas for problems appear in this report in the form of • The almost five thousand more spent on Boys Basketball equipment and supplies.
		The thirteen and one half thousand dollars spent more for Boys Baseball equipment and supplies.
		 The three and one half thousand more spent for Boys Baseball travel.
		 But maybe the most potential red flag comes in the area of awards where
		the Baseball team received over two thousand dollars more on awards
		than the softball team. There is probably a reason for this but the report does not give any indication of why this vast difference is allowed to take
		place.
