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T 35 & T 36 Explanations

- Baseball chose to play in a tournament in Florida over spring break. Not any of our teams chose to play in tournaments that many miles away.
- Football there was a 16.42 percent disparity between male and female expenditures on the T 36 form. This is due to the higher cost to safely maintain and equip a football team. \$4,383 was spent on reconditioning helmets, shoulder pads and replacing helmets and shoulder pads. This is a yearly expenditure that must take place to ensure that our athletes are playing in safe equipment. Without football there would be a 10.91 percent financial disparity, with more money being expended on female athletics versus male athletics.
