Data, calculations, and responses indicate the school is not currently meeting the standard established in any of the three tests for provision of athletic opportunities. The most recent student survey shows some interest in both bowling and slow pitch softball for girls. Since neither of these sports is currently sanctioned by KHSAA and the school offers 21 total team opportunities for girls and the same number of boys teams, it seems the standard established in Test 3 is being met. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending seems to be well within acceptable parameters.
