X	Other Recommendation and Comments: The calculations, data, and responses submitted indicate that the school is meeting the standards established in all three tests for the provision of athletic opportunities. Because of the indicated interest in volleyball (48) on the most recent student survey, compliance on Test 3 is unconfirmed. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to slightly favor the male athletes. This spending should be monitored for provision of equitable benefits.

- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Flow 3, Column 1 3) and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. Note: If the percentage of current participants added in the last five years is 25% or greater, compliance with Test Two may be possible. If less than 25%, then compliance with Test Three should be analyzed. <u>CAUTION:</u> 25% is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard.
