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Policy for Displaying Honors/Awards

As discussed in the May 2009 Gender Equity Committee meeting, a policy for displaying honors and awards will be formally established to begin in the 2009-10 school year. The policy will read as stated in the items below:

- Every sport offered at Fairview High School shall have a banner/sign displayed at its respective competitive facilities that recognizes any post-season or All "A" Classic championship.
- All male and female state championship winners will have a plaque displayed in the main entrance of the George Cooke Memorial Gymnasium.
- All KHSAA postseason trophies will be displayed in the high school cafeteria.
- The Fairview High School Hall of Fame was established in 2006 to honor the accomplishments of alumni and teachers, coaches, and administrators. See the bylaws below.

The Fairview Alumni Association will have a set of officers and an advisory board. The advisory board currently consists of the members involved in the initial organizational meetings of the association. From this board, a set of officers consisting of a president, vice president, secretary, reporter, and treasurer have been established. To provide consistency for the progress of the alumni association, the advisory board and officers will permanently remain in place unless a member chooses to step down. At that time, the board will choose a replacement for the open position.

The officers and advisory board will hold a meeting on an annual basis to make any needed changes to the bylaws and to determine events for the upcoming school year. If an alumni association member who is not on the board wishes to amend a bylaw, a vote of the entire association may be forced by turning in a petition with signatures from at least 75 percent of the association members. This petition needs to be given to an officer of the association, and an open meeting for the purpose of voting on the issue will be scheduled within two months of the date the petition is turned in to an officer. Only issues discussed on the petition may be voted on in the open meeting.

Each year, the advisory board and officers will determine teams from the past at Fairview to be honored and recognized. Team recognition will occur during the last home basketball game before Christmas. Also, the advisory board and officers may select individuals each year who have remarkable athletic accomplishments for individual recognition in a particular sport including jersey retirements in rare instances. If a person is selected for jersey retirement, his or her number will not be permanently retired, but a replica of the jersey or other chosen symbol will be displayed in an appropriate location for that particular sport.

The advisory board and officers will be responsible for the development and management of the Fairview Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame will begin in 2006 with its inaugural class, and a new class will be inducted each year. Any alumni association member can make nominations for the Hall of Fame at any

time during the year. These nominations need to be e-mailed to the Alumni Association President, Rex.Cooksey@fairview.kyschools.us or they can be given directly to any officer or member of the advisory board. The advisory board and officers will take these nominations and vote to determine the inductees for each new class. The following criteria will be used to evaluate each nominee for possible induction.

- A. If the nominee is a graduate of Fairview, he or she must have graduated within a period of no less than 10 years and he or she must have achieved something at an extraordinary level either from an academic, athletic, or extracurricular nature during his or her four years of high school.
- B. A graduate can also qualify for induction to the Hall of Fame if he or she has accomplished something extraordinary after graduating from high school. These accomplishments should be identified by the nominating member so the board and officers can evaluate all pertinent information about the nominee.
- C. A person who is not a graduate of Fairview can still be nominated for induction if he or she has made a positive and profound impact on the school either from an academic, athletic, extracurricular or administrative capacity. (Example: Teacher or Coach)
- D. If any extenuating circumstances exists, the board and officers may consider those factors in voting to determine the eligibility of nominees.

Policy for Displaying Honors/Awards

As discussed in the May 2009 Gender Equity Committee meeting, a policy for displaying honors and awards will be formally established to begin in the 2009-10 school year. The policy will read as stated in the items below:

- Every sport offered at Fairview High School shall have a banner/sign displayed at its respective competitive facilities that recognizes any post-season or All "A" Classic championship.
- All male and female state championship winners will have a plaque displayed in the main entrance of the George Cooke Memorial Gymnasium.
- All KHSAA postseason trophies will be displayed in the high school cafeteria.
- The Fairview High School Hall of Fame was established in 2006 to honor the accomplishments of alumni and teachers, coaches, and administrators. See the bylaws below.

The Fairview Alumni Association will have a set of officers and an advisory board. The advisory board currently consists of the members involved in the initial organizational meetings of the association. From this board, a set of officers consisting of a president, vice president, secretary, reporter, and treasurer have been established. To provide consistency for the progress of the alumni association, the advisory board and officers will permanently remain in place unless a member chooses to step down. At that time, the board will choose a replacement for the open position.

The officers and advisory board will hold a meeting on an annual basis to make any needed changes to the bylaws and to determine events for the upcoming school year. If an alumni association member who is not on the board wishes to amend a bylaw, a vote of the entire association may be forced by turning in a petition with signatures from at least 75 percent of the association members. This petition needs to be given to an officer of the association, and an open meeting for the purpose of voting on the issue will be scheduled within two months of the date the petition is turned in to an officer. Only issues discussed on the petition may be voted on in the open meeting.

Each year, the advisory board and officers will determine teams from the past at Fairview to be honored and recognized. Team recognition will occur during the last home basketball game before Christmas. Also, the advisory board and officers may select individuals each year who have remarkable athletic accomplishments for individual recognition in a particular sport including jersey retirements in rare instances. If a person is selected for jersey retirement, his or her number will not be permanently retired, but a replica of the jersey or other chosen symbol will be displayed in an appropriate location for that particular sport.

The advisory board and officers will be responsible for the development and management of the Fairview Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame will begin in 2006 with its inaugural class, and a new class will be inducted each year. Any alumni association member can make nominations for the Hall of Fame at any

time during the year. These nominations need to be e-mailed to the Alumni Association President, Rex.Cooksey@fairview.kyschools.us or they can be given directly to any officer or member of the advisory board. The advisory board and officers will take these nominations and vote to determine the inductees for each new class. The following criteria will be used to evaluate each nominee for possible induction.

- A. If the nominee is a graduate of Fairview, he or she must have graduated within a period of no less than 10 years and he or she must have achieved something at an extraordinary level either from an academic, athletic, or extracurricular nature during his or her four years of high school.
- B. A graduate can also qualify for induction to the Hall of Fame if he or she has accomplished something extraordinary after graduating from high school. These accomplishments should be identified by the nominating member so the board and officers can evaluate all pertinent information about the nominee.
- C. A person who is not a graduate of Fairview can still be nominated for induction if he or she has made a positive and profound impact on the school either from an academic, athletic, extracurricular or administrative capacity. (Example: Teacher or Coach)
- D. If any extenuating circumstances exists, the board and officers may consider those factors in voting to determine the eligibility of nominees.
