- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

Henry County High completed an Athletic Field House last year. This year the athletic department raised 75,000 dollars for equipment, flooring, lockers and other items. This facility has a new weight room for all our athletes to use. In addition there is a boys locker room, girls locker room, and a 60x80 work out room. When assessing the value for this facility to the athletic teams I used the following formula:

Also During construction in our gym, there was an accident in the boys' locker room. A set of uniforms, some chairs, and some bags had to be replaced. This resulted in the boys expenditures being larger than expected.
