- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. #### Plans to Address Interest:

- 1. Our 2007-08 survey showed that we had students interested in wrestling. We conducted an informational meeting with students that were interested in starting a wrestling team. We invited all male and female students interested to a meeting in the library. There was not enough interest among the students to proceed with starting a team. The Title IX committee decided to revisit this in the fall of 2009.
- 2. We have had several students ask us about starting a ping-pong league. Asst. Principal, Mr. Russ Buchanan, has put together a ping-pong tournament, which hopefully will lead into an intramural league for students. He had over fifty students to sign up to participate in this tournament. We plan to address this again in the fall of 2009. I have also contacted some area schools about participating with us in hopes of getting ping-pong off the ground and competing against one another.
