Dear Mr. Tackett:

Our Gender Equity Committee has a concern which we would like to share with you as the commissioner who now supervises the officials of all sports in the KHSAA. After several conversations with our girls' basketball coach, it was brought to our attention that perhaps the assignment of officials for girls' games was not equitable with the assignment for boys' games. When I contacted some other AD's and some current and former Assigning Secretaries of this and other regions, I found that this was indeed the case for a variety of reasons.

One explanation was that the girls' game was a "slower" game and the less experienced officials were better suited to the pace of the game. Another was that older officials were more able to work girls' games instead of boys'. In one instance I was told that some officials simply refuse to work girls' games. Our GEC understands that officiating basketball games is sometimes an impossible task, but it is our belief that none of these explanations is acceptable. At best, it appears that our girls are providing a "training ground" until the officials are ready for the boys.

At Meade County High School our GEC, our Board of Education, our Administrators, and our Coaches work diligently to insure that all our athletes are treated fairly and equitably. Annually, we document many resources in preparing our Title IX Report. We are asking that the KHSAA respond to this concern and let us know if it is legitimate and how the equitable assignment of officials is documented to insure that the girls' game is not shortchanged.

Thank you for all you do for our athletes across the State.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. ITEM # 1: The Gender Equity Committee felt it would be advantageous for the Girls' Basketball Program if more Double Headers were schedule with the Boys' Basketball Program.

ITEM # 1 STRATEGY: The AD will work with the coaches of both programs and attempt to increase by at least one the number of double headers currently scheduled. The deadline to accomplish this will be June 1, 2009.

ITEM #2: For some time the girls' basketball coach has had a concern that the officials assigned to girls' games were not as experienced and well-trained as those assigned to the boys' games. The GEC felt this issue should be addressed to determine if there is a difference in the officials assigned.

ITEM #2 STRATEGY: The AD will send a letter to Julian Tackett at the KHSAA expressing this concern and asking that he respond with his perception of this issue. This letter will be sent by April, 15, 2009.
