TITLE IX COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Monroe County High School

April 3, 2009

The Monroe County Title IX Committee met April 3, 2009, at Monroe County High School. Present were Julie Nuckols (coach), Jessa Curtis (student representative), John Petett (Co-Athletic Director), Dwayne Murray (Co-Athletic Director), Debbie Wilson (coach and parent), Tara Turner (coach and parent), Jeff Rippy (coach and parent), and Liz Willett (Title IX Coordinator).

The minutes from January were approved.

Mr. Murray gave an update on the Title IX report that he is preparing and that is due April 15. He said the numbers look good for compliance.

Mr. Murray and Mr. Petett reported on spring sports. Mr. Petett said that the baseball team record is currently 1 – 3 but that the team is improving with each game. He also commended the baseball facilities. The softball team has only played one game so far but is scheduled to play on Monday, April 6. Coach Wilson said that the restrooms at the track need some attention, especially the downstairs boys' restroom. The girls only use one side of their restroom. Mr. Petett said that he would have the maintenance staff check on these. Coach Wilson said that she had seventeen girls participating this year and that she was very pleased with her squad. The tennis teams have played two matches. According to Jessa, the boys are good and the girls are getting better.

Coach Turner stated that she would be surveying middle school girls after Spring Break to see how many would be interested in playing volleyball this spring. Ms. Willett suggested she talk to the principal at the middle school to determine the availability of the gym.

In regard to maintenance, Murray and Petett reported that a gate has been put on the softball dugouts; they are getting enough wind screen for the softball field; they have bought a mower to be used for baseball and softball; and gym floors will be re-finished during the dead period this summer. David Turner now works on all sports maintenance. Both men wanted to state publicly what a good job the custodial staff does on the cleanliness of the gym. They said they had been in many gyms this year and ours was by far the cleanest.

The athletic directors also said that they are in the process of hiring a girls' soccer coach, and they are also going to try to hire an assistant coach for both boys and girls.

Jessa mentioned that tennis practice is too short for girls. Our tennis teams only have the two courts at City Park for practice, so boys and girls must share. The athletic directors said they would address the practice issue with the coach.

In other concerns MCHS will be hosting the district baseball tourney in May. The ADs are scheduling dates for CPR classes for all coaches. Coaches will be attending medical symposiums this year. The ADs are trying to be proactive with regard to the new sports medical bill that passed the legislature recently, and they are making sure that they will have the required equipment and training.

The next meeting will be in September/October 2009.

TITLE IX COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Monroe County High School

September 29, 2008

The Monroe County Title IX Committee met September 29, 2008, at Monroe County High School. Present were John Petett (Athletic Director), Dwayne Murray (Athletic Director, coach, and parent), Tara Turner (coach), Debbie Wilson (coach), Jessa Curtis (student), and Liz Willett (Title IX Coordinator).

Ms. Willett began the meeting and asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes from the last meeting. They were approved as read.

The new student member, Jessa Curtis, and new Athletic Director, John Petett, were introduced as new members of the committee. Coach Petett and Coach Murray are now the co-Athletic Directors at the high school.

A report was given on all fall sports. Coach Petett reported that the football team is having a good season; they are 5 – 0 at this point. He has 72 boys on the squad this year. He is looking to finish the season strong.

Coach Turner also had a good report on the volleyball season. In a rebuilding year her girls are 15 – 9 with all the losses coming in three game matches. They are the number one seed in the district. Volleyball Senior Night will be held Thursday, October 2. She has 31 girls on the three volleyball teams this year.

The girls' golf team was playing in the region at the time of this meeting. There is only one high school golfer on this team with the rest being from the middle school. The boys' team consists of four high school players and one middle school player. Ally Walden and Matthew Anderson have both had good individual years, and the boys' team has been successful.

The soccer season is winding down, and there was considerable discussion on the lack of numbers for both the boys' and girls' teams. Coach Wilson commented that she has had games where she could not compete with a full team. With middle school players not allowed to compete against juniors and seniors, her team has had to play most of their games short-handed. The boys' coach Mike Elrod has been out with health issues. Both coaches have indicated that they will not coach next year. With all of these issues Coach Petett and Coach Murray want to look at the feasibility of keeping soccer as a varsity sport. They plan to have a meeting with all interested parties after the season is over.

The cross country team has only one girl and two boys competing this year.

Again the possibility of spring volleyball at the middle school was discussed. Coach Turner said that she would coach the team if they are given permission to have one. The Athletic Directors commented that the middle school would be responsible for covering the cost of fielding a team, and they were not sure the middle school would be able to do that. Ms. Willett said that she would check at the central office to see what could be done.

In an update on maintenance issues, Coach Turner mentioned that there were still bulbs out on the scoreboard. Coach Murray said that he had contacted the maintenance department who said they would get to it as soon as they could. Ms. Willett offered to talk with them to see if she could get this done any sooner. Coach Wilson asked for access to a restroom at the track during track season. A.D. Petett indicated that he would take care of that situation. The discussion then turned to the need to refurbish the track in order to hold home meets.

Jessa had no questions at this time.

The next meeting will be in January.
