Explanation of Salaries for Paris High School Athletics:

For coaching stipends at Paris High School, our coaches receive a % of their salary and depending on the sport of a specific number of extended days. For example, the Head Girl's basketball coach and the Head boy's basketball coach each receive the same stipend for coaching. Both coaches get 14% plus 18 days. The salaries can differ if one coach has more teaching years than the other. The percentages and the days are the same. Another example is baseball and softball. The head coaching stipend for both the head coach for baseball and softball is 5%.
