X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data submitted and corrected on the T-1 form, the school is likely meeting the standards established in Tests 1 and 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. In relation to Test 3, the school's most recent athletic interest survey seems to support the responses given on the T-3 form. School officials should monitor the marginal interest indicated in girls cross country. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be outside of acceptable parameters both on a percentage and per athlete basis (approximately \$639 per male athlete and approximately \$487 per female athlete). This spending should be closely monitored to insure that this disparity does not continue over a two-year period. Any disparity which occurs in the future should be a part of the school's Corrective Action Plan.
