According to data and responses submitted, the school is likely meeting the standard established in Test 3 for provision of athletic opportunities. Currently all KHSAA sanctioned sports for girls are offered at the varsity level except swimming, and 15 total team opportunities are available for girls as well as boys. In the area of benefits, the school has been unable to access all travel expenses in the past. Beginning with the April 15, 2010 report, these expenditures will be reported. According to the T-35 and T-36 forms, total athletic spending is currently within acceptable parameters on a per athlete basis.

 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
