		There are some immediate concerns that the Gender Equity Committee needs to address
		 In looking at the T-41 form the school indicates an advantage to the boys program in regard to equipment and supplies and support services. On the same page it indicates "if an advantage is shown, corrective action should be shown on the T-60 Corrective Action Plan. That correction action plan has not been addressed.
		 The overall spending for boys and girls is becoming a major issue and may well be a red flag issue. The Gender Equity Committee needs to meet in the very
		near future and set forth a detailed corrective action plan that will correct a
		problem that appears to have been building over the past three years.
		2006-2007 Annual Report Figures –
		Williamsburg had 148 male participants and spent \$729.00 per male athlete.
	÷	Williamsburg had 159 fernale participants and spent \$530.00 per female athlete.

This report indicated that each male athlete at Williamsburg received \$199.00 more that than each female athlete. When you are a football playing school these figures will never be equal but when the difference in spending per-male athlete compared to per-female athlete is more than \$100.00 a potential red flag goes up. It makes it even harder for a school to explain when the female participation percentage is higher than the boys.

2007-2008 Annual Report Figures -

Williamsburg had 124 male participants and spent \$618.80 per male athlete. Williamsburg had 126 female participants and spent \$556.63 per female athlete. This report indicates that each male athlete at Williamsburg received \$62.17 more than each female athlete. This reflected that the school was going in the right direction and trying to make the overall spending between male and female athletes more equal.

2008-2009 Annual Report Figures -

Williamsburg had 102 male participants and spent \$1,053.06 per male athlete. Williamsburg had 97 female participants and spent \$829.27 per female athlete. This report indicates that each male athlete at Williamsburg received \$223.79 more than each female athlete. This is very much a red flag issues and an immediate corrective action plan needs to be put in place.

The Gender Equity Committee needs to submit by September 1, 2009 an updated corrective action plan that will address the above issues. Copies of the Gender Equity Committee Meeting minutes for the past three years need to be submitted with the new Corrective Action Plan.

- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
