There does appear to be to be an interest in girl's golf as indicated on the most recent student interest survey. In order to continue to meet Test 3, this interest should be addressed by the Gender Equity Committee and be made part of the Corrective Action Plan. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is outside the recommended parameters both on

a percentage and per athlete basis. This spending should be closely monitored by
administrators in order to insure that this disparity does not continue over a two-year
period. Oversight of athletic spending should be part of the school's Corrective Action
Plan.
