1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads). Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

#### Addendum to Title IX Corrective Action Plan

After reviewing the Actual Expenditures Program Comparison Chart (KHSAA form T35), Christian County High School would like to add several items to the Corrective Action Plan (KHSAA Form T60) for our 2005-06 Title IX Report relating to payment of coaches.

There is a discrepancy in the money that booster clubs are paying in coaching supplements between the boys and girls athletic programs. Below is a plan outlining the steps that Christian County High School will take to rectify this problem.

- 1. Insure that all booster money that is allotted for additional coaching supplements be deposited with the Christian County School District to be paid to the additional coaches.
- Limit the number of coaches that will be allowed on each staff. The number of coaches that will be allowed to be added to the district approved positions for each sport will be regulated by the number of athletes participating on the team.
- 3. Recruit additional girls coaches to provide additional opportunities for our women's athletic programs.
- 4. In comparing similar athletic programs between girls and boys, if there is a discrepancy in the number of paid coaches between the programs then:
  - a. Encourage the hiring of additional coaches at the expense of the girls booster program.
  - b. If booster money is not available to hire additional coaches, the expense will be absorbed by the athletic department.
  - c. Restrict coaches from working with the boys program to insure equity.

With proper monitoring and proactive planning, Christian County High School will adjust to inequity that is present in the payment of coaching supplements by our athletic booster clubs.
