E	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data and responses submitted, the school is meeting the standard established in Test 1 for the provision of athletic opportunities. The standard established in Test 3 is also likely being met, but the school has only a 78% return rate on its most recent athletic interest survey. Therefore, compliance cannot be verified. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be outside acceptable parameters both on a percentage and a per athlete basis. This spending should be closely monitored for provision of equity and oversight of this spending should be a part of the school's Corrective Action Plan.

T 35 & T 36 Explanations

• Football – there was a 15.2 percent disparity between male and female expenditures on the T 36 form. This is due to the higher cost to safely maintain and equip a football team. Each year we spend around \$6,000 to recondition helmets, shoulder pads and to replace helmets and shoulder pads. This is a yearly expenditure that must take place to ensure that our athletes are playing in safe equipment. Without football there would be a 20.8 percent financial disparity, with more money being expended on female athletes versus the male athletes.
