The responses on the T-3 form indicate that the standard established in Test 3 is also being met. The information given on the most recent student athletic interest survey does not seem to support the responses on the T-3 form. The indicated interest in girl's volleyball (36) and girl's tennis (17) should be validated before the standard established in Test 3 can be met. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to show parity.
