E	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data, calculations, and responses submitted by the school and corrected by KHSAA representatives, the school is not meeting the standards established in any of the three tests for the provision of athletic opportunities. There is a chance the school is meeting the standard established in Test 3, but the responses on the T-3 are not supported by the results of the most recent student athletic interest survey. Only 19 students were surveyed out of a possible 84. This is not a representative sample of the student body. Failure to meet the minimum standards in relation to opportunities may be the most significant deficiency in relation to Title IX. This document will serve as a notice to the school that the student athletic interest survey is to be administered each of the next two school years (2010-11 and

2011-12). The responses on the T-3 form should be based on the results of those surveys. A return rate of at least 80%, as designated on the T-63 form, must be received on the student interest survey. The steps being taken to meet the standard of at least one of the three opportunities tests should be a part of the school's Corrective Action Plan. School officials are also reminded that KHSAA recommends that each Gender Equity Review Committee have student representatives. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be within acceptable parameters both on a percentage and per athlete basis.
