- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team.   - Football raises the overall expenses of our male athletes for many obvious reasons. First of all, the amount of participants as well as the general cost of necessary equipment is much greater than any other sport. There was \$8300 spent on some new helmets, shoulder pads, helmet parts, and replacement leg pads. This was necessary to replace some out of date equipment. During the school year ending in 2009, we had to purchase new football headsets at a cost of \$4,700. There were new replacement jerseys and pants purchased due to wear and tear. The coaching salaries are more than other sports, due to the number of coaches needed to supervise.
  - Our wrestling team participated in the state tournament.
  - Baseball took a spring break trip. All sports teams are allowed to take an out-of-state trip every other year. Trip MUST be board approved and booster clubs must cover all expenses.
