

→The meeting started at 4:15 pm and ended at 5:20 pm.

→Introductions were made.

→Discussed KHSAA Forms requirement

The AD explained that he must get all the facts first before working on the forms. It takes him at least 2 weeks to complete all the KHSAA required forms.

→Discussed KSD Coaches Equity Survey

The AD collected 5 replies from coaches via e-mail. Then he collected 3 more at the meeting. The AD went thru all the surveys and discussed each survey with all the committee members who were presented at the meeting.

- 1. For Awards, No concerns mentioned.
- 2. For Equipment, Only 3 coaches reported that they are having sufficient need for more uniforms. Boys Basketball team 11 years old uniforms. The order for new uniforms last summer was turned down. Soccer team several uniforms are missing, different uniforms, and need larger sizes for bigger boys. Volleyball team numbers on jerseys come out and shorts are showing signs of wear and tear.

The AD explained about the uniform replacement chart. The Boys basketball team was supposed to get new sets of uniforms in the year of 2008-09 but we didn't order then because we needed money for the Mason-Dixon basketball tournament which was held here at KSD.

The original uniform replacement chart

- 1. Boys Varsity Basketball 2008-09
- 2. Girls Varsity Basketball 2009-10
- 3. Soccer 2010 11
- 4. Volleyball 2011-12
- 5. Girls and Boys Track 2012-13

Since we didn't order any new uniforms for the Boys Varsity Basketball team for the last two years, then the order of purchasing new uniforms for each team has been bumped two years later. Since the boys' basketball, Soccer and Volleyball teams are desperately in need of purchasing new uniforms; we agreed to do these three teams (BBK, VB & Soc) first as soon as possible. The girls' basketball uniforms are still in

good condition for at least another year. The AD will need to have a meeting with Mr. Buis, Principal about the uniforms. We can not keep up on postponing the order for boys' basketball team any longer.

- 3. For Facility, there are no concerns.
- 4. For Schedule [Games and/or Practices], Games no concerns. Practices times are the most concern among the coaches. Most of them want long practice times after the school 4 to 6 pm instead of 4 to 5:15 pm. We, the committee agreed to have supper time to be changed from 5:00 (MS)/5:15 (HS) to 5:45 (MS)/6:00 (HS) except for the game days 4:30 pm for ALL MS and HS students. The changed meal times should be in effect for the school year of 2010-11. The AD will meet with Mr. Buis about this situation. Cheerleader team feels that they need more practice in the gym. The AD explained about the priority of using the gym Boys and Girls Varsity basketball teams have the first priority to use the gym. Then Rec. Basketball teams are the next to use gym. The AD tried his best to find some time for Cheerleader team to practice in the gym. We only have one gym. We lost Rogers Gym which was so suitable for Rec. basketball teams to practice there.
- 5. For Meals or Transportation, There is one concern about the meals. One coach feels that fruits need to be included in sack lunches and pre-game meals. He mentioned that he himself talked to Janice, the food director. Janice said that she usually does not buy a lot of fruit because a lot of them have gone a long time without being eaten by the students. For Transportation, there are no concerns.
- 6. For Budget, there is one concern. One coach wanted to know an exact amount of money each team could spend.
- 7. For other ?s, there is one concern. One coach feels that school needs to pay for First Aid/CPR certification for all coaches since the school pays for Medical Symposium and KCEP. The AD feels that the coaches need to pay for First Aid/CPR themselves. The committee members agreed to it.
- 8. For any suggestions for improvement Only three coaches replied back. One coach wanted to see games schedule to be more fair and competitive for our girls and boys team. The AD explained that he already wrote a letter to KHSAA asking for a waiver of Article VIII for KSD for the school year of 2010–11 and beyond. One coach wanted to see supper to begin at 6 pm. This would allow practice from 4:15 to 6:00 pm. One coach stated that this was a great year!

→ We discussed about doing the Student Survey coming up this Friday. Lisa Kingsley and AD will do the MS group (8th graders only) in the morning. Stu Harper, Daniel Morgan and Neil Carrington will do the HS group (9th to 11th graders) at the noon during the HS meeting. When all is done, the surveys need to be handed to Scott Johnson for the summarized report – T-63 form. He will report the result at the meeting on Tuesday, March 16th. The AD reminded them that we must have more than 80% of the surveys back from the students.

We agreed that final meeting will be on Tuesday, March 16, 2010 at 4:00 pm in the Green and White room.

Items for discussion: 1) Student Survey Result - Scott Johnson and 2) Corrective Action Plan

1) Students Athletics Interest Surveys: The percentage of total surveys returned from 8th graders is 100% while for 9th to 11th graders, it is 82%. Total number of surveys were given out was 46, 40 surveys were handed in, 40 out of 46 is 86.9%.

For Fall Sports, There were 9 boys signed up for football while 6 boys signed up for soccer. 12 girls signed up for volleyball. We concluded that we will stay with the soccer program for the boys and volleyball program for the girls.

For Winter Sports, 9 boys signed up for basketball while 8 girls signed up for basketball. We also concluded that we will stay with the basketball program for both boys and girls.

For Spring Sports, we concluded that we will stay with Track since we don't have any facilities for baseball, softball and tennis.

We decided that we will stay with the programs we currently have at KSD.

2) Corrective Action Plan: We will follow up on the last year's corrective action plan of purchasing the video camera and digital camera for Athletic Department. There is no corrective action plan for next year. However, we need to follow the uniforms replacement chart as we need to purchase 3 new different uniforms for each sport – Boys basketball, Boys Soccer and Girls Volleyball teams.

Information Sharing:

Bluegrass Conference Meeting – Monday, March 15th. The AD explained about the possibility of getting 3 other small schools to join in the conference. They are Augusta, St. Patrick and Deming. If they all accepted to be a member of Bluegrass Conference, there will be two divisions in the conference. For Northern Division will be Augusta, Deming, Nicholas Co, Paris and St. Patrick. For Southern Division will be Berea, Burgin, KSD, Model and Sayre. There will be Bluegrass Conference Meeting on Monday, May 10 at 11 am at Sayre HS.

KSD Annual Sports Banquet – Thursday, May 6th. The AD explained that Keith Westhoelter, Head Coach of Indiana school for the Deaf will be our guest speaker.

KSD Girls and Boys track teams will go to Alabama School for the Deaf to participate in ASD's track meet on April 17th. There will be 5 Deaf schools participating in the meet. They are Mississippi, North Carolina, Alabama, Indiana and Kentucky.

The AD will start working on Title IX report which will take him at least 2 weeks to complete. He has to gather all needed information for the report and financial report from each sport team this year.

The AD thanked all committee members for their willingness to participate in this committee. He values their inputs and discussions as they want to see KSD Athletics' program operating very well.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 pm.


