According to information submitted, the school is likely meeting the standard established in Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. Starting a girls golf team in 2010-11 makes meeting the standard possible. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is far outside of acceptable parameters for provision of equity. This large disparity is mainly due to facilities improvements at the football complex. If this project is completed, the report for next year should show more equity in this area. SCHOOL OFFICIALS SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR ALL ATHLETIC SPENDING SO THIS DISPARITY DOES NOT CONTINUE OVER A TWO-YEAR PERIOD.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 1,00%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8. If less than 25%, then compliance with Test Three should be analyzed. <u>CAUTION</u>: 25% is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard.
