According to data and responses submitted, the school is meeting the standard established in both Tests 1 and 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. Although there is an indicated interest in girls swimming, there does not appear to be enough schools in the geographic area currently offering the sport for the development of a "reasonable schedule of competitions." In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be within acceptable parameters on a per athlete basis. Thanks for your continued efforts in relation to this project.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
