X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data, calculations, and responses submitted by the school, it is meeting the standard established in Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. The responses on the T-3 form appear to be supported by the information compiled from the most recent student athletic interest survey. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending seems to be outside of acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis. Since this disparity has continued over a two-year period, monitoring of athletic spending should be a part of the school's Corrective Action Plan, and the specific steps taken should be documented in the school's Gender Equity Review Committee meeting minutes. School officials are reminded that KHSAA recommends that each school's Gender Equity Review Committee have student representation. Placing students on the committee was a part of the school's 2008-09 Corrective Action Plan, but the GE-19 for this year does not document that this has been accomplished.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
