T-3 is the area of concern at this time. The Gender Equity Committee has somewhat addressed the issues of Volleyball and Football. It is very understandable why the sport of Football can't be handled financially at this time, but there appears to be very slow progress in the Student Interest shown in Volleyball. To help us get a better idea of the steps the Gender Equity Committee has made we need the minutes of the Gender Equity Committee for the past

Equality Explanations:

The girls show less monies spent in equipment and supplies, however it was the boys' rotation for new uniforms. The girls' basketball team had their dressing room renovated in school year 2007-08. The boys' locker room was renovated in 2008-09. This created a difference in monies spent on facilities improvements.

There is a discrepancy in girls and boys soccer equipment and supplies due to the boys' team requiring practice jerseys and this not being the year for boys' soccer uniform rotation. However, the girls traveled more than the boys did as the expenditures indicate.

There was a little more spent on awards for boys' soccer because there were more boys who were seniors, thus receiving more awards for senior night.
