

Plans to Address Interest:

North Bullitt will offer wrestling as a sport beginning in the 2010-2011 school year. It will be offered to both girls and boys although there was only limited interest among girls. With the addition of wrestling, North Bullitt will now offer every KHSAA sanctioned sport except for Slow Pitch Softball. In addition, North Bullitt plans to reinstate its boys JV soccer team for 2010-2011. This will mean that North Bullitt will offer the same number of varsity, junior varsity, and freshman teams for both girls and boys.

Although not currently sanctioned by the KHSAA, there was also sufficient interest to add an Archery program for both girls and boys for the 2010-2011 school year and to begin the process of possibly adding a Field Hockey team for girls for the

2011-2012 school year. Starting a Lacrosse team for both girls and boys is also being studied.




